Course and Curriculum Information:

The Intermediate theatre arts student is expected to achieve a proficient level of mastery and understanding in audience etiquette and performance evaluation. Additionally, each student will actively participate in one or all of the following activities:

- set design and implementation
- physical and emotional representation
- public performance
- character development and analysis with monologue and duet performance
- critical evaluations of productions
- peer direction

Materials:

Students are expected to bring a smile and an open mind to class every day. I will provide daily materials such as a pencil or highlighter. Sometimes you will be asked to bring in random things to create puppets, costumes or props. If you need any help with these, see me and I will make sure you have what you need.

Grading Policies

Weighting of Grades

Grades in Theatre Arts are weighted according to the following scale:

Daily Work:	50%
Quizzes/Tests/Projects:	40%
Respectful participation:	10%

Late Work Policy

For work submitted after the due date given in class, the following policy will apply:

- 1 class day late: grade may be reduced up to a maximum of 10 points
- 2 class days late: grade may be reduced up to a maximum of 20 points
- 3 class days late: grade may be reduced up to 30 points (or teacher discretion)
- Late work will not be accepted after 3 class days.

Retake Policy:

Students who fail a major test/assessment (below 70%) will be allowed to retake or correct up to a 70% grade. Students will have to make arrangements with the teacher to retake or correct a major test/assessment. Students have one week after tests/assessments are returned to do retakes or corrections. Students are encouraged to attend tutorials.

Tardies, Absences, & Missed Work

Students are encouraged to be responsible for collecting work from each teacher after an absence or. Extra copies will be made available, if needed. Students have one extra day for each day they were absent to complete a missed assignment. Arrangements for taking a missed test or quiz must be made with the teacher.
